ABOUT THE PIECE

This SATB choral piece is set to the poem of the same name, penned in Elizabethan England by William Browne. The story outlines a well-known ancient Greek tale of mythological creatures that seduce and lead sailors to their doom. In this setting of Browne, I chose to utilize the different vocal ranges of the choir as characters in the plot, with high voices embodying the eerie quality of sirens, and low voices acting as the sailors. The two groups call to each other, echoing the other, only converging once the spell has been cast.

ABOUT THE COMPOSER

Carol Mak is an artist (alias *Kayee*), producer and composer from Toronto, Canada. Her music has been broadcast on national Canadian radio and television, notably her song "Bruises", which won "Best Lyrics Award" on Fairchild Radio's SongQuest 2020. She received her education studying under prolific Canadian composers Larysa Kuzmenko and Eliot Britton, who both encouraged her to lean into her vocal arrangement prowess and electronic influence. After receiving her Masters from Berklee NYC, Carol moved to LA to be mentored in pop writing and production by early 2000s hit-makers Stargate. In the pas year along she has built a catalog of work with artists-to-watch from all over the world, fusing her classical music influence with a modern palette.
